# Welcome Karen to the ASA (WA)

We would like to welcome Karen Sagenschneider to the ASA. David Krygger (WA) kindly sent the following letter to introduce Karen and to provide a brief background on Karens life as a musician. *Note Karen is a Senior Scientists outside music.* 

Karen started on piano at 9 years of age, She was top music student in WA in 1963 in year 12, studying with Edward Black, who was President of the Music Teachers Assoc.



in WA for many years. Coincidently, I studied theory with him and adapted it to the accordion.

Karen achieved her A.Mus A in 1966 and was involved in playing for weddings, parties and with a small chamber group. In 1974, she joined the Edelweiss Dance Group at the Rhein Donau Club as a dancer, however the group later needed a mobile musician and this led to her taking up the accordion in 1997, self taught.

She also joined a small group of accordion players at the club and when the leader returned to Europe, the group approached me for help. I suggested that they should contact Eddie Staszak, who accepted the position. Unfortunately Eddie fell seriously ill and again I became involved, which led to an influx of new players, so I took up the position as conductor/arranger and the group was eventually formed into the Perth Accordion Orchestra. Karen was of course one of the original members. However she also played with one or two other groups as well as performing solo at fairs, dances, carnivals and concerts. As musician for the Edelweiss Dance Group, she plays at many performances including Octoberfests. The group travels interstate for festivals.

She also sings with the University of WA Choral Society. Karen and her close friend and former 2nd accordionist with the Perth Accordion Orchestra Karen Gourley, together with a few others, play at aged facilities and private concerts. Both Karens were in the Perth Accordion Orchestra for the whole 10 years of our existence.

Karen's diligence and dedication to improve is evident as she is practising advance studies with me and she tells me that she is enjoying the challenge.

# Le 14 Juilet 2015 Bastille Day Contributed by Annick Lucchetti

It is exactly 50 years since I celebrated the 14<sup>th</sup> July 1965 in France and danced in the streets of Paris with Luigi, to the sound of the accordion.

Two years later I started a new life in a new country and the 14<sup>th</sup> July became almost extinct, except for my good friends who would ring me and wish me a happy Bastille Day

My daughter has never missed a year to wish me a happy Bastille Day, an important date for me and many other French people, this is the date that France got rid of The King and the time France became the country of Liberte Egalite Fraternite, the time Rouger De Lisle wrote La Marseillaise with very gruesome lyrics.

The 14<sup>th</sup> July often was a sad day for me, no more dancing in the street of Paris, no more accordions, well no more Bastille Days.

Many years later I encountered the ASA and heard the ACCORDION again and got the opportunity to hear many great accordionists , accordionists who even could play French tunes. During my ASA years I heard Ross play many times and after my ASA years I heard him less and less.

This year I saw on Facebook a show about Bastille Day at the Foundry in Sydney,

with Nadia Piave, Ross Maio and guitarist Gino Pengue. I must go to this show and as I was committed, I decided I was going to



this show with friends or alone. Luigi and Sophie joined me and both commented "anything to make you happy, then we will come with you " The show is about to start, Nadia is dressed accordingly almost like the revolution time, Ross is wearing a beret Basque a red scarf and navy and white long sleeves stripped T-shirt and look like a Frenchman and the guitarist is in black. A great trio, Nadia is the vocalist, Ross the Accordionist and Gino the guitarist.

I got to hear many French songs and tunes close to my heart, Nadia is now singing la Complainte de la Butte, the lyrics and music of this song create and move my emotions. I have not heard this song since I left France. (I was in Montmartre over two years ago) I am having visions of Place du Tertre with all the artists, musicians, the cafes, the Sacre Coeur and the view of Paris

Sophie is loving every minute of the show and takes lots of photos, Luigi is enjoying the performance, he loves Paris, and I also loved every second of the show. The show ended far too soon.

Nadia has a great voice and is very articulate with her French songs. The musicians were also great. Vive Nadia, Ross, Gino, Vive la France and of course vive l'accordeon.

The Italian background of this Trio delivered a true Bastille Day feeling to us and the whole audience. I am now looking forward to my next year Bastille Day in 2016.

# Giorgio Albanese in Sydney Concert Apríl 2015

On April 30 I attended an accordion jazz performance by Italian Giorgio Albanese with my wife Maria plus Sylvia Granturco and Maria Worthington,

It was a very good performance, a totally different style of music from what most people are used to hearing from an accordion. He played the accordion like an acrobat showing the best of his virtuoso where his left hand on the bass was as fast as his right hand was on the keyboard. He produced special sounds and at times testing the very limits of the accordion and even included strange and varied sounds by way of tapping all around the outside of the accordion and even improvising by whistling.

At the end of the show, Sylvia noticed a sheet of paper on one of the chairs which was a summary of Giorgio Albanese music career that the show presenter had left behind. As the presenter had already departed, it was suggested it be passed to the ASA for inclusion in the Accordion Review which has been done and may be found on the next page.

#### Giorgio Albanese Accordionist, composer, improviser

Giorgio Albanese is a young Italian accordion player, composer, and improviser from Ostuni in the Apulia. Giorgio began playing the accordion at the age of eight and soon after he started participating and winning various national and international competitions.

He has been involved in various musical projects ranging from Jazz to contemporary music, world and free improvisation collaborating across various multidisciplinary artistic fields such as theatre, dance, and cinema.

He obtained a degree summa cum laude in "Jazz Music" at the Conservatory "Niccolò Piccinni" in Bari, Italy, a second degree in "New Composed and Improvised Languages" at the Conservatory in Monopoli, Italy, and at the 2009 Umbria Jazz Festival he won the title of "The Best Talent" in his category which included a scholarship at the Berklee College of Music in Boston. He studied and attended seminars with performers and musicians such as Kent Carter (USA), Jhon Thicai (DEN), Jerry Bergonzi (USA), Gianluigi Trovesi (ITA), Karl Berger (USA), Luigi Giannatempo (ITA), Greg Burk (USA), Alessandro Sbordoni (ITA), Dick Oatts (USA).

Throughout his career, he has collaborated with several Italian and international renowned musicians including Jhon Thicai (DEN), Gianni Lenoci (ITA), Steve Potts (USA), Mikael Swafirowski (FIN), Ricardo Tejero (SPA), Dominic Lash (UK), and William Parker (USA).

Giorgio Albanese has taken part in several musical projects and performed in concerts throughout Europe, in China, USA, Argentina, Russia and North Africa.

He has been awarded the following prizes:

Italia Award – Jazz Accordion – 1st prize;

- World Accordion Championship - 2nd prize;

- 4th Accordion Art Festival - Italia Award 1st prize;

- International Competition "Premio Leo Ceroni"- 1st prize;

National Roland V-Accordion Festival – 1st prize;

Primus Ikaalinen Competition – 2nd prize;

- International Competition "Città di Lanciano" - 1st prize;

#### LAS VEGAS ACCORDION CONVENTION 2015 By Heather Masefield

On the 18th June Amber and Heather Masefield left for Las Vegas via Honolulu to attend the Las Vegas Accordion Convention, held annually at the Gold Coast Casino, directly opposite The Palms Hotel of Rat Pack Fame. Temperature was up to 43 degrees, with the wind off the desert not a cool breeze but a heat that burnt your retinas. We had a few days to shop and see the day time and night time hotels/shows at the strip. When Grayson arrived we took him into the strip to see the large hotels, darting into Mirage, Paris Caesars Palace, and Bellagio to keep cool. Into accordion things with Grayson giving hour long lectures each day and practicing for his concert, 3 to 4 hours daily. Each day had a structure with the mornings being taken up with lectures, then a sit down lunch in the ballroom followed by a concert then orchestra rehearsal then a break (where we would sneak off to the pool) followed by a Formal Dinners then a further concert. I loved this well organized accordion convention attending as many workshops as I could.

Grayson was surprised to discover that at every morning at 9am he was advertised as a Clinician giving lectures. These proved very popular, with his audience growing each day. Amber and I realised that he is now a world authority on Accordion Effects, Different styles of Tango Music, Perfecting your Technique and giving Master Classes. I was amazed at the confidence he displayed and how he handled the audience of between 50 to 100 in these sessions, having them interact, and answering questions fluently in such an amusing manner that often had the crowd laughing. Paul Pasquali, the organizer was delighted with his young and enthusiastic Guest Artist. Grayson also took part in a question and answer panel with Joan Sommers, Mary Tokarski etc.

Maxine Hartman, my Fathers accordion teacher, lives in Las Vegas and came along with her sister to hear Grayson play at his concert on the final night. As this was sold out I had to ask for special seats to be placed for them. Each evening we have a formal 3 course meal in the hotel ballroom followed by a concert. Everyone dresses for dinner. Grayson certainly stunned the audience, playing 4 classical pieces, followed by different styles of tangos. The audience especially floored by the Maori work written for him by Gorka Hermosa titled Ka Mate – what was that angry young man doing yelling odd sounds when he was playing and slapping his hands everywhere??? They accorded him a long and prolonged standing ovation .
