

If you are ready to take your accordion playing to the next level, come along and join us for a full day workshop with great presenters and welcoming and participatory sessions. The day will suit adult players of all levels.

Some of our presenters will be familiar to you, having been long time members of our accordion family.

Well known performer and teacher, and long-time ASA member and mentor, Cathy Day, will present 'Express yourself: Using dynamics to enhance playing and musicality'. Without expression even the most beautiful pieces of music may not sound quite so beautiful! Cathy is going to demonstrate how players can work to improve dynamic control and phrasing.

Music teacher and performer, our very own Amelia Granturco, will be presenting' 'Explore yourself: Gaining confidence in improvisation'. This workshop will be really valuable to those of us who feel just that bit too attached to our sheet music but would love to learn to jam with others.

Our ASA President and accordionist about town, Ben Pattinson, will present 'Extend yourself: Developing performance skills'. There is much more to performing than just

playing the notes correctly. In this workshop Ben will share tips and tricks on how to play confidently, embellish your playing and engage your audience.

The last session for the day will be 'Go folk yourself: The Accordion in Folk Music and Good Tunes Session' presented by David De Santi. In a 'Good Tunes Session', David provides sheet music and leads the participants in playing folk tunes from around the world. A down and out musician was playing his accordion in the middle of a busy shopping mall.


Striding over, a policeman asked, "May I please see your permit?" "I don't have one", confessed the musician.



#### Schenwsc from Schenzhen Festival

July 23th to July 27th 2017, the Shenzhen Bao'an International Accordion Festival was held in Shenzhen, China, and I had the opportunity to compete in it

My Dad and I travelled together to Shenzhen and it was a great experience. I decided to enter because my parents thought I should have more opportunities with playing the accordion and have a good learning experience. Also, I had never experienced an international competition before so it was new to me.

I entered a month before it and in the last 2 weeks prior to leaving, which were luckily the school holidays, Lionel let me practice at the Music Education Centre every day for about 8 hours. This was what definitely helped me improve alot before the competition. With Lionel and my teacher Campbell's help, I learnt so much about how to play, and to not just play the notes, but express yourself, and to feel the music.

Shenzhen is a new technology city, in 30 years it had grown from 20,000 to 15 million people and I had a lot of fun seeing the different culture. I went to some Chinese theme parks and also went to alot of very large busy malls, which are so much bigger than malls in New Zealand. The subway was also a very efficient way to travel, so we were able to see a lot of different areas of Shenzhen and saw a lot of great sights. A good thing about going to China for me was the fact that I know Chinese so I could understand what people were saying. This made it way more convenient to communicate with people.

The competition was spread out over 5 days, and I performed on the last day of it. Every night I got to watch musical concerts and learn how professional musicians perform. It was such a great learning experience.

On the last day of the festival I competed in something called a Knock-out competition, where there were four rounds and after each round people would be eliminated. I played in the first and second rounds, and came fourth overall, winning about \$100 in New Zealand dollars.

I am very grateful for the opportunity to be able to compete internationally playing the accordion, and it also made me love my instrument much more.

Thank you Lionel and Campbell for helping me succeed at this competition. I learnt so much from this experience and I can't wait to do more with the accordion in the future.
