

## News from the Paddington Music Studio (Sydney) by Zeljko Bedic

Dear ASA members / accordion friends,

Early last year my good friend Ross Maio asked me if I would like to take over teaching one of his accordion students, Honggian Zhang (Draven) who was studying Bachelor of Music (B Mus) at the University of Newcastle (UON), majoring in performance on the Accordion. I gladly accepted the challenge. The first step of the process was that I had to undergo their rigorous induction to become a UON Academic. This was carried out by Dr Helen English, School and Community Engagement Director, Senior Lecturer in Music and Dr Philip Mathias, B Mus Programme Convenor, Conductor from the Echology School of Creative Industries, Faculty of Education and the Arts, OUN. Once this was successfully completed, I then commenced tutoring Draven for his B Mus university requirements for which he had to travel all the way from Newcastle to Sydney, to my Paddington Music Studio on a regular basis. After around one and a half years, I am delighted to announce, that with a lot of hard work, commitment and perseverance, Draven has been successful in being awarded with his Bachelor of Music Degree (performance major on Accordion) at the end of his final semester in the middle of 2018. This is another outstanding achievement and big win for the Accordion in Australia, which I am honoured and proud to have been a part of. Congratulations Draven, well deserved!

Along with some of my other accordion students, I invited Draven to one of Ross', Marchello's and Lukas' performances in March this year at the Camelot Lounge. He came down from Newcastle with his girlfriend and thoroughly enjoyed some of the best accordion performances in the country. He said that it was very inspirational. Thank you Ross and sons for an absolutely fantastic and memorable accordion extravaganza!

## New AMEB Accordion Syllabus status update:

As you would all be already aware from my previous article on this topic some time ago, Tania Marx, Milica Krga and I have been working on reviewing and completely overhauling the current AMEB Accordion syllabi (Technical requirements, List Pieces and all of the other associated components) over the last four years. It has taken us hundreds of voluntary hours of our time and has been a challenging process due to our work, teaching and family commitments. However, I am glad to say that we got there in the end, and I am extremely pleased and excited to announce that we have submitted the new AMEB Accordion syllabus to Mr Bernard Depasquale, Manager AMEB Federal on 7 Feb 2018 for the AMEB's review and approval. I have recently spoken to Mr Depasquale on the progress of this process and he advised that everything is going very well and that they are now sending the new proposed syllabus to be reviewed by a panel of AMEB examiners. He was very hopeful that the new syllabus will be released for examining by the end of 2018. This is fantastic news for all accordion teachers and students all over Australia.

We are appealing to all accordion teachers across Australia to put forward as many students for Accordion AMEB exams so that we can keep the Accordion syllabus alive for many years to come. We are hopeful that the new, freshly updated syllabus will start to see a significant increase in the number of candidates sitting for their Accordion grade exams and all the way up to AMusA and LMusA Diplomas, the latter, which I'm examining a candidate for in October with the **AMEB NSW Head of Keyboard** 


If numbers stay very low as they have been for a number of years now, or even worse, decline even further, the AMEB will remove the Accordion syllabus from being able to be examined, and that would be an absolute tragedy after all of the incredibly hard work that has been done to have the Accordion included into the AMEB examining system and now to completely overhaul the syllabus in an attempt to bring it into the 21st Century. Everyone, please

help us keep it alive.

NB Due to the lack of any candidates for Free Bass Accordion, this syllabus has already been removed in by AMEB Federal in 2017 and is no longer examinable. The new Accordion syllabus will replace the existing Free Bass and Stradella (Standard Bass) syllabi i.e. there will only be one syllabus moving forward called Accordion. I will let you all know when I receive the final announcement from Mr Depasquale later in the year.

Lastly, my wife Sonya and I went on a beautiful six week holiday to Cuba, San Francisco and New York from the beginning of June to mid July this year, where we enjoyed some amazing live music along the way, such as Latin, Jazz, New Orleans Jazz etc. The reason for the trip was to celebrate Sonya's 50th Birthday which was in June when we were in New York (she's always wanted to go there). When we were in San Francisco, we visited the infamous Alcatraz prison, which is on a small island off the coast of the San Franciso mainland. While we were walking around, having a look at some of the prison

cells and taking a few photos, we stumbled across one of the cells that had an **Accordion** lying on the bed. I found that to be fascinating and took a photo to share with you all. It was the only instrument in any of the cells, well how about that:) Enjoy!



## NEWS FROM NEW ZEALAND ACCORDION ASSOCIATION

## NZAA Presidents Report - July 2018

In August 2017, the 70<sup>th</sup> Coupe Mondiale championships
were held in Osimo, Italy. This year, the official New Zealand delegation
consisted of myself, Harley Jones, Grayson Masefield and Heather Masefield. Harley Jones also attended in his capacity as CIA Public Relations
officer along with Grayson Masefield in his capacity as a CIA music committee member and member of the international jury together with
Heather Masefield and Stephanie Poole. Amber Masefield and Tamba
Carleton from the NZAA committee also attended. A large group of Kiwis
travelled over for the event including Kiwis now based in Europe and participated in World Accordion Orchestra IX at the final concert. Some extended their stay to enjoy the accordion festival in nearby Castelfidardo
which immediately followed the Coupe Mondiale. There were no candidates competing for New Zealand but NZAA member Owen Fan did a fine
job competing in the junior virtuoso entertainment category representing
China.

Grayson Masefield released two CDs at the Las Vegas Accordion Convention in October 2017. He recorded a third CD of Baroque transcriptions in New Zealand and is currently recording a fourth CD with his Piazolla group in Italy. Grayson has given masterclasses in Italy, USA, China, New Zealand and Germany. He has provided performances for many national accordion organisations including at the Berlin Philharmonica Hall as a

soloist with the string orchestra.
