Presidents Report

As we head into the last quarter of the year I am optimistic. It is and remains a great shame that so many musicians have had to sacrifice so much. As a live musician I myself have been affected both financially and emotionally. From five live



shows a week to three live shows in six months, the disappointment has mounted. Many people have returned to their normal lives. Businesses are running, restaurants, bars, shopping centres. In the midst of this there still is little possibility that we could even start working anytime soon. Oktoberfest is cancelled and Christmas will certainly be affected. There is a general reluctance by venues to consider live music as an option, which is most likely due to large fines and infringements being a real possibility. I am not looking for sympathy, I would just like people to see the difficulties that we face at this time. When venues start to reopen we need you to support local music again. I hope that our governing bodies will see it this way and invest in the arts.

The Australian Accordion Teachers association held an amazing competition. With restrictions in place Tanya Marx received entries from all over the world. We judged the competitions online from videos that competitors sent in on various video platforms. Follow this link <u>https://www.facebook.com/groups/accordionsydney/</u> to see all of the videos. You can also get a copy of the results and more. With this year such a success the AATA are looking at holding a domestic competition as well as providing an online competition for players in 2021. Thank you to the AATA committee who work so hard to bring us these great accordion players.

Finding appropriate music or appropriately notated music for

students and musical groups has always been difficult. To eliminate this problem I use a program called Sibelius. It is your typical MIDI based program. When I'm looking for a piece of music that suits a student or group I rarely find something suitable. I save time by arranging pieces to suit the ability and level of the student/group. I find this a great way to tailor a course to students, needs and desires. This year I have started to arrange for the Accordions Alfresco group. A great deal of time however is spent inputting the source data into MIDI programs where you can then get to grips with the arrangement itself. For those of you unfamiliar with the process, you usually input the melody and bass lines. We do this manually via computer keyboards/mice and midi keyboards. After this you can start assigning parts and writing extra harmonies/counter melodies. Recently I have started to use Photoscore & Notateme. I am now able to scan my music or a PDF that I have bought online without entering all the source material manually. Photoscore then creates a draft version for me to check over before I start editing it in Sibelius. The cost of these types of programs at the time of purchase seem high, but time-savings are huge. I am looking forward to sharing some of my new works with you soon.

It is and always will be my absolute pleasure to represent the Accordion Society of Australia.

Bundaberg Accordion Group by Jennifer James







A Word of Greeting from Dr. Karl Albrecht Majer

When the 1st Coupe Mondiale was held in Paris in 1938 probably no one thought that one day this competition would be held in the Southern Hemisphere in New Zealand.

In the past 42 years the Coupe Mondiale took place among other cities — in Brighton and Brussels, in Milan and Vienna, in New York and Stockholm, in Malta and Toronto, in Caracas and Prague, in Versailles and Copenhagen. The Coupe Mondiale of 1980 in Auckland is anew the best demonstration for us, that we may call the prize of the International Competition of Accordion Soloists, "Coupe Mondiale", for good reasons; for not only players from all parts of the world, join in that well, in order to hold the competition. We were pleased to accept the invitation of our energetic member association, the New Zealand Accordion Association, to host the Coupe Mondiale of 1980 in New Zealand.

We have been watching the upward development of the accordion in New Zealand, and the precious pioneer work for music in general, and for the accordion in particular, carried out by the New Zealand Accordion Association for years, with great interest. Acknowledging the especially active co-operation in our World Association, we have appointed New Zealand hosts for the 1980 Coupe Mondiale, and unanimously elected their delegate, our friend Harley Jones, vice-president of the Confederation Internationale des Accordeonistes. We are therefore eagerly coming to New Zealand, and we are sure that the first performance of the Coupe Mondiale International Competition of Accordion Soloists in the South Pacific, will be beyond all expectations.

In the name of the Confederation Internationale des Accordeonistes-IMC-UNESCO, 1 thank the New Zealand Accordion Association for organising the 33rd Coupe Mondiale, and 64th General Assembly of Delegates Congress, and 1 thank all the authorities and friends of the accordion for their support.

I wish all the competitors, adjudicators and delegates a good flight and a nice time in New Zealand, and hope that the 1980 Coupe Mondiale will be a memorable experience, demonstrating the wide world of music, with all its power to unite peoples.

These very popular Variety Concerts, are usually held 3 times a year, and feature the Christchurch Accordion Orchestra with conductor David Thorne (President of CAA), with accordion players and guest artists from the community.

Welcome music was provided by Raelene Turner who bravely played her accordion alone without her life-long friend Joffree Marshall (who passed away suddenly on July 15th) beside her.

The Christchurch Accordion Orchestra started the concert with a tribute to Joffree by playing 'Old Comrades March' by C Tieke, a piece he had learned to play after being given the music by David. The Orchestra finished their first segment with 'Camptown Twist' and 'Fine and Dandy Polka'.

Soloists included young players Sven Balvan who played an own composition and a Greek piece, and Theodore Redepenning who played 2 solos – a Frosini Tango and 'Czardas', then later in the programme Sven and Theodore joined together for duets – 'Suomalinen Polka' and 'Primeli Waltz'.

Next was Merle Kershaw and 'The Southern Celtic Fiddle Orchestra' (picture above) to add a different ethnic flavour to the afternoon's entertainment.

Some well-known songs from the 'Christchurch Theatre Workshop Sing Group' had the audience singing along, and a ukulele and guitar group "Rhythm Method" played and sang with beautiful harmonies to help add variety to the programme.

The Christchurch Accordion Orchestra concluded the concert with 'Tanzande Finger', 'Alexanders Ragtime Band', and lastly another tribute to Joffree the 'Colonel Bogey March'.
